The awards and presentations were held last week at Parliament House. The award celebrates the benefits and contribution of language education to the ommunity. The marking criteria for primary and high school entries were language accuracy, creativity, performance skills, film quality and adherence to the competition rules. The film was chosen out of more than eighty entries. It will also be used for teachers' conferences, professional development and future projects.



New Resources



Over recent weeks Rose Bay Public School has been purchasing many literacy resource books to support the implementation of the new NSW school curriculum that takes effect in 2014.

The school has been able to purchase an additional \$800 of books courtesy of Hart Estate Agents, from referrals they have received from school families.

Principal Gai O'Neill believes each and every book provides immense support and professional learning to the teachers as they look to implement the NSW syllabuses for the Australian Curriculum.

"These rich literacy books, many of which are picture books for K-6, will enable our teachers to focus on creative and critical thinking, visual literacy and, importantly, appreciation of literacy for all the students at Rose Bay Public School," Ms O'Neil said.

Stocktake is here and our borrowing has now ended for the school year. Please return **ALL** books as soon as possible. It is very important that our departing Year 6 students return all of their books as well before they move on to their new schools and new adventures. Stock take is part of the school's audit of resources to see which books are missing, need replacing or to note those areas where we need to focus on developing the collection. The library appreciates the school community support in this matter. We look forward to the return of school resources.

2013 has been another big year for the library, with new soft furnishings and mobile spinner stands purchased, bulletin boards replaced. Close to **1900 books were accessioned** and **over 13,372,000 items were borrowed** during the school year. Students have already contributed to the 2014 suggestion book list to help with purchasing those books that they love to read! We also now have **33 parents who are members of our school library** and we look forward to welcoming more in the new school year. Congratulations to the 58 students who successfully completed the **Premiers Reading Challenge** this year. We are anxiously waiting for the certificates to arrive. Remember, that books read over the summer holidays can be registered for the 2014 Challenge!

A huge thank you to our **dedicated library monitors**. They have helped enormously both during lunch and class times to shelve books, return and borrow books, label and even more

As the final library newsletter of the year we would like to wish the RBPS school community happy holidays and happy reading! It is important that our students continue their reading over the summer. Young readers who don't continue to read over the summer – especially those who are reluctant or at-risk – are likely to lose crucial ground.
