Kale Salad Recipe



INGREDIENTS

1 bunch of kale
1/3 cup parsley – chopped finely
5 florets broccoli – cut into small florets
½ cup sunflower seeds, pepitas, & walnuts
Juice of 1 lemon
4 tbspn Olive Oil or Flaxseed oil
Sea Salt to Taste

OPTIONAL EXTRAS

1 Avocado, chopped into small pieces
1 large tomato, chopped into small pieces
1 cup quinoa or brown lentils for extra protein

METHOD

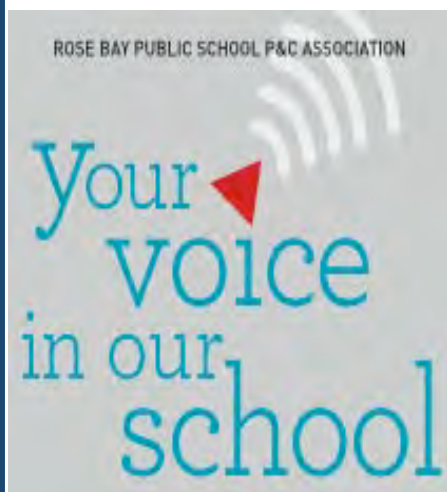
- Cut off the stems of the kale and chop finely. In a large bowl add the oil, lemon and salt to the kale and toss through. Set aside for 20 mins to soften.
- Blanche the broccoli in boiling water for a few minutes, drain, refresh in cold water and leave to cool.
- Add the broccoli, parsley, nuts and seeds to the kale leaves. Toss and serve!

Even though you will soon see a new smiling face serving in our canteen the online ordering system run by flexischools will continue . So its business as usual with flexischools. www.flexischools.com.au

Get Online Saves Times

Our school has a great online ordering system for the **Canteen** called FlexiSchools. This system allows parents or students to place orders from home or work up until 9.30am on the day. The payment is also done online, so **you no longer need to send cash or a paper bag order to school**. As well as being convenient for parents, the online orders are much faster and easier for the canteen to process - so it makes everyone's life a little easier. FlexiSchools is well established and tested, operating in hundreds of schools across Australia.

Getting online is easy and only takes a second to register. Simply go to www.flexischools.com.au and click "**Register Now**". You will be sent an email with further instructions on how to complete the registration. Once registered, you can start placing orders immediately. If you have any questions, FlexiSchools provide a great **help desk on 1300 361 769**, or you can contact them via their website or via email: help@flexischools.com.au

The system operates via a pre-paid account, so you don't need to scrounge for coins in the morning and can easily budget for your canteen spending throughout the term.

There are a variety of payment options supported, including Visa, Mastercard (credit and debit), BPAY and Direct Deposit. **To avoid merchant fees you can do a bank transfer.**

Term 3 Invoice Payments are now Overdue.

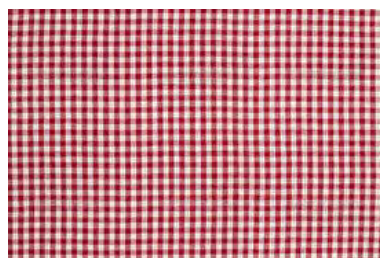

On Tuesday afternoon, Week of Tastes continued with students enjoying a taste lesson where they were blindfolded and learned about the influence of senses on taste.





BONJOUR!

Les élèves de français en 4^{ème} ont commencé un nouveau programme, « **Histoires en action** », qui encourage l'acquisition de la langue à l'aide d'une pièce de théâtre.

With our French students in Year 4 we have started a new method of language learning (AIM) which is based on acquiring high frequency vocabulary by speaking only French during class time. Each word is accompanied by a specific gesture to help the children understand and remember the words. Students are kept engaged and talking in French at all times.

Important notice about changes to the afternoon school bus route 606

Good news! After months of discussions, Sydney Buses is proposing to change the route of the 606 school bus to accommodate parent requests for a broader service, and to service a larger portion of the school's catchment area, including parts of North Rose Bay, Dover Heights and Vaucluse.

Background

Following the survey of school families conducted in 2012, and consultation with the P & C and School Council, the school has been in discussions with Sydney Buses regarding the 606 bus route.

Currently the 606 school special travels to Bondi Junction via North Bondi and Bondi Beach but does not service the areas to the north of the school (i.e. North Rose Bay, Vaucluse and Dover Heights). Many school families live in those areas. Those areas also encompass a large portion of the school's official catchment zone.

The 2012 survey showed that a much larger number of students would use the bus if the route covered those additional areas.

New route

The new route would involve the bus turning left onto Old South Head Rd from Albemarle Ave, right onto Military Rd, right onto Koboda Rd, left onto Peel St, left onto Lancaster Rd, right onto Military Rd, right onto Lyons Rd, left onto Hardy St, right onto Murrivier Rd, left onto Mitchell, left onto Wairoa Ave, right onto Campbell Pde and then express to Bondi Junction.

A map showing the proposed new route is attached. The bus would primarily use existing bus stops along the route. One or two new bus stops may also need to be created.

There would be no change to the bus's current departure time from the school (ie 3.32 pm daily). However, the trip will take longer. Sydney Buses anticipates that the bus will arrive in the Bondi Basin and at Bondi Junction Interchange approximately **16-18** minutes later than the current arrival times.

The new route will cover most of the existing route, as well as the additional areas outlined above. The only areas which will not be covered by the new route are Old South Head Rd between Albemarle Ave and Murrivier Rd, and the western end of Murrivier Rd. Students wishing to travel to Old South Head Rd south of Albemarle Ave, or who wish to make a quicker journey to Bondi Junction via Birriga Rd, will be able to use the existing 633 school special route. That bus stops outside the school every afternoon and takes a more direct route to Bondi Junction. The route for the 633 bus will not be altered.

Supervision

A teacher is currently rostered on each afternoon to supervise students as they wait for and board the 606 bus. This arrangement will continue when the new 606 route is implemented. Teachers will not be able to supervise students wishing to use the 633 route or any other government buses.

Timing

The school has not yet been notified of the proposed start date of the new route but we are hopeful it will be before the end of the 2013 school year. We will keep parents informed of progress.

Bus fares

Children who live more than 1.6km from the school (radial distance) and all children in K-2 are entitled to a free school bus pass. Application forms are at the office. Children not eligible for free travel are welcome to use the bus as fare payers. Term bus passes are available from State Transit for \$50.00. Alternatively, students can pay per trip or use a "Travel Ten" bus ticket. Paying adults may accompany a child using the school bus.

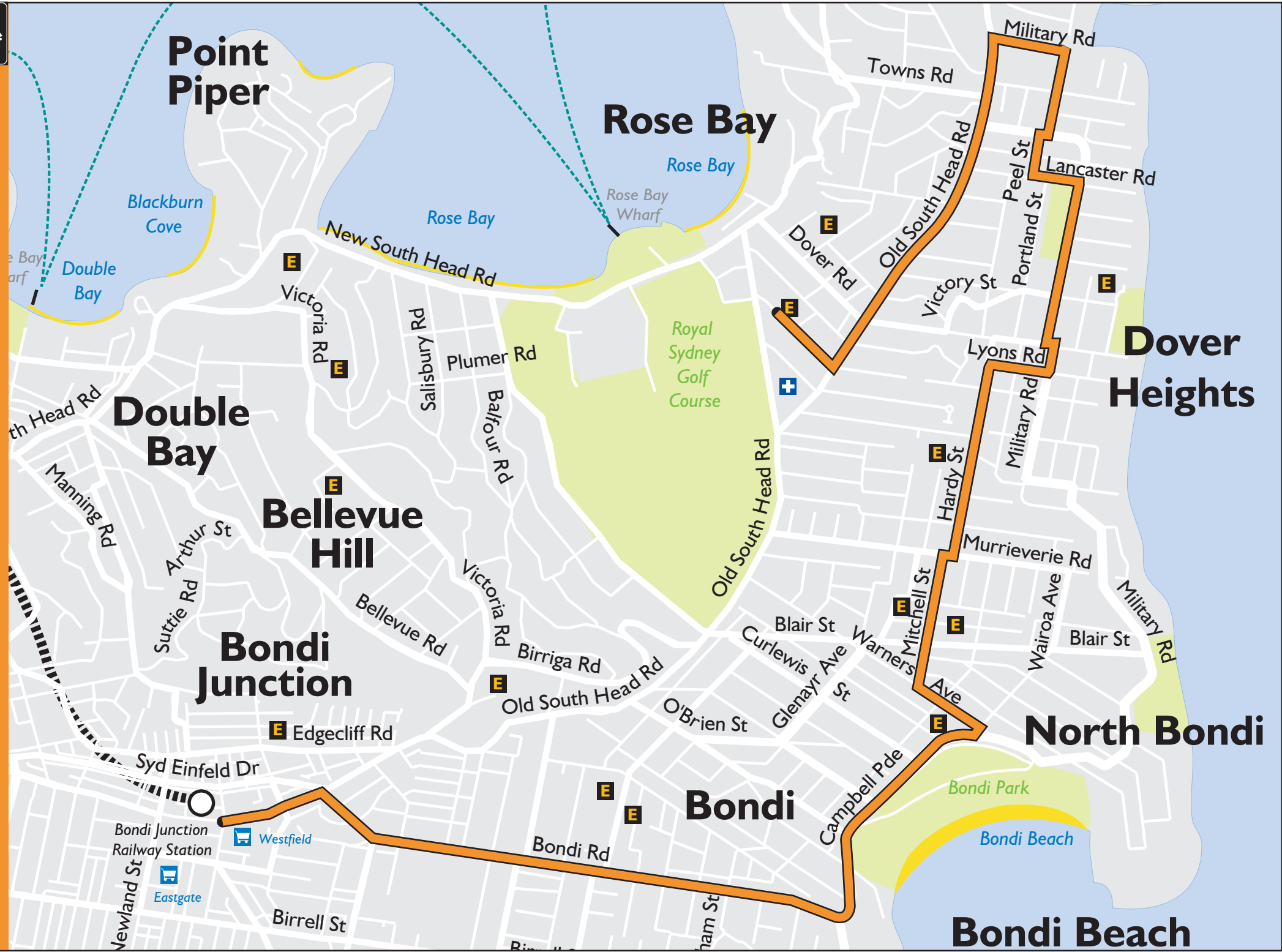
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This is a wonderful development which will directly assist many school families, and will also help alleviate the growing traffic pressures around the school.

Pick up and Drop Off Procedures for Wilberforce Ave “Go-With-The Flow”



The following applies for picking up children after school:

- **DO move your car all the way to the front of the car line** to allow other cars to move in behind you.
- **DO move your car forward while you are waiting in the car line**, as spots open up in front of you.
- **DO pick up your children swiftly** keeping in mind there are many cars waiting to join the line
- **DO Circle the block** if there are no spots available.
- **DO explain the pick-up procedures to your children** so they understand they need to wait for you outside the school gate along the school fence.
- **DON'T Double park on Wilberforce Ave while waiting to join the car line.** This is illegal and you can get fined by police.
- **DONT stop in the “No Stopping” zone**, even if you are waiting to enter the pick-up zone. This is illegal also. If there are no spots available you will need to circle the block and come back a few minutes later.
- **DON'T Stop in the first spot you see.** Please go all the way to the front of the two minute zone to allow other cars to move in behind you.
- **Don't reverse your car into a vacant spot.**
- **DON'T Leave your car at anytime.** If you need to go into the school, please park elsewhere legally.

The following applies for dropping off children to school in mornings:

- **DO move your car all the way to the front of the car line** to allow other cars to move in behind you.
- **DO drop off your children swiftly** keeping in mind there are cars waiting to join the line
- **DONT stop in the “No Stopping” zone**, even if you are waiting to enter the pick-up zone.
- **DON'T Stop in the first spot you see.** Please go all the way to the front of the two minute zone to allow other cars to move in behind you.
- **DON'T Leave your car at anytime.** If you need to go into the school, please park elsewhere legally.
