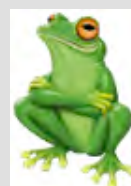

- Sandwich in a snug-fitting reusable container
- Snacks in a reusable container
- Water, juice or other drinks in a reusable and resealable bottle, filled at home from a bulk container
- Yoghurt in a small reusable container, filled at home from a bulk container
- Whole fruits without packaging or fruit pieces in reusable containers
- Raw or salad vegetables such as carrot, lettuce, tomato, cucumber and celery, plus a small container of dip.
- Muffin, fruit bread or biscuits in a reusable container

Feel free to come along to the next working bee or perhaps one next term. Everyone welcome to drop in on our sessions for as long as you like.

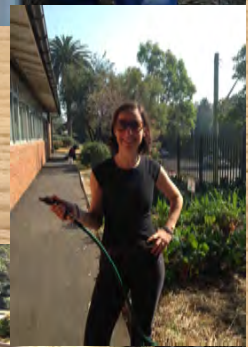

Science in Kindergarten



The Kindergarten Scientists have been busy conducting experiments to create the best bubble solutions.

Our keen Scientists thought long and hard about the bubbles, and then posed questions about which ingredients could create the best possible bubbles. The Scientists came up with many theories and had the opportunity to test out their hypotheses.....



Children created and compared different types of bubble solution. "I can see rainbows in it" observed Miller, excitedly!



The children in Year 1 are exploring the effects of the pull of gravity and the push of air and water through observations and investigations.

The students observed and made predictions about how forces act. We engaged the students by using toys. The students were able to explore and explain their observations. In the elaborate phase, the children could extend their understanding and inquiry skills. For the evaluation students understood that if you change a variable the results will change.

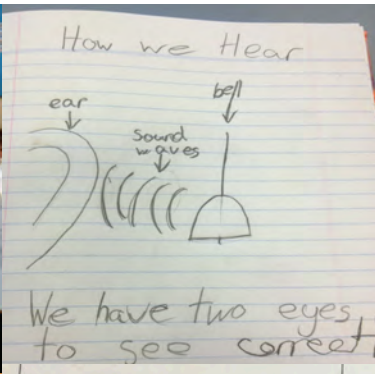

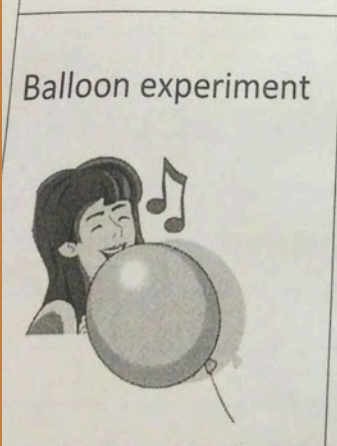

Science Year 2

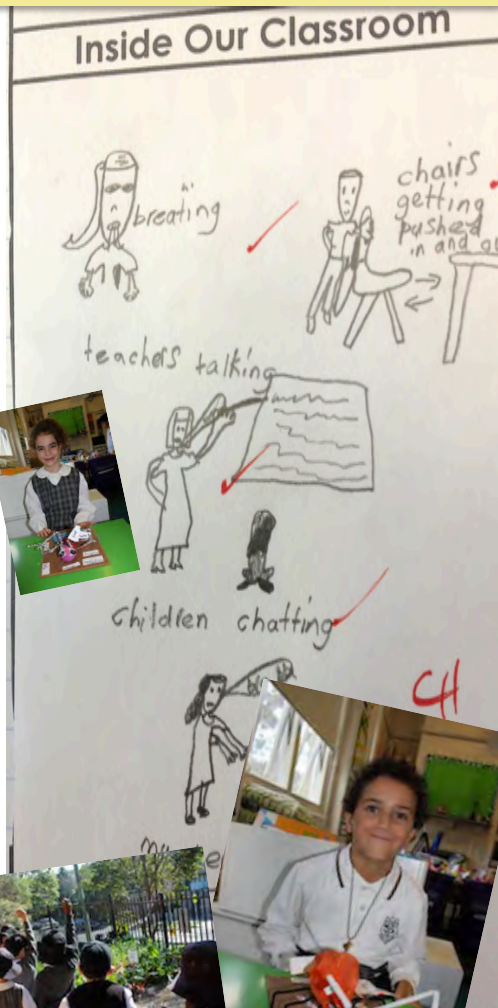


This Year Year 2 has engaged in many exciting hands on science investigations.

In Semester 1, students learnt about forces using push and pull toys and living things (Insects and Spiders). Year 2 experimented with a range of water toys and designed and made their own insect or spider.

This term students are exploring sources of light and sound and how these move.

Walking around a bustling playground, students used scientific explanations to express what they observed and compared their responses to those made inside the classroom.



Science Break!

What a way to break up the day! Across the school students spent ½ an hour engaged in slimy, bubbly and totally hands on experiments.



The Floating Egg

Aim: To find out which liquids an egg will float in.

Materials

- 4 glasses of water
- salt
- sugar
- flour
- fresh eggs



STEPS

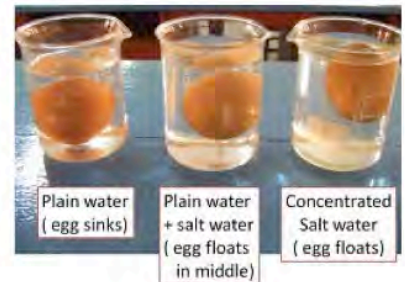
1. Fill each glass three-quarters full with water.
2. Stir a few tablespoons of salt into one glass of water, until it dissolves.
3. Stir the same amount of sugar into the second glass of water.
4. Stir the same amount of flour into the third glass of water. Leave the fourth glass of water plain.
5. Guess which glass of liquid the egg will float in. Now try them all!



Science with 3S

Did You Know?

Density is how tightly the matter of a mixture is packed together. For example, an egg, is more dense than plain water, so the egg sinks. Salt water, however, is more dense than an egg, and so the egg floats! Are you more or less dense than sea water? **Note:** If the egg is stale it will float in water because gas forms inside the egg when the egg is going bad. You can use this trick to check the freshness of an egg.



Salty Ice

Did You Know?

Salt makes ice cubes melt faster. Plain water freezes at 0 degrees celsius. Salt lowers the freezing temperature of water; so the ice cube in salt would have to be made much colder than 0 degrees celsius to stay frozen. At room temperature this is not possible, so the ice has to melt.





Science Day



On Thursday August 23rd, regular programming in 4D was brought to a halt and Science Day activities began to erupt. Hands-on investigative science is a big focus at Rose Bay Public and this was a special chance for students to get messy and enjoy science at the same time.

Orange Life Jacket

Our first experiment involved oranges. Placing the oranges in water, we found they floated, but when the peel was removed, they sank. We learned that the orange peel has tiny air pockets that allow the orange to float. We also learned about displacement and why really heavy cruise ships can float but small marbles sink straight away.



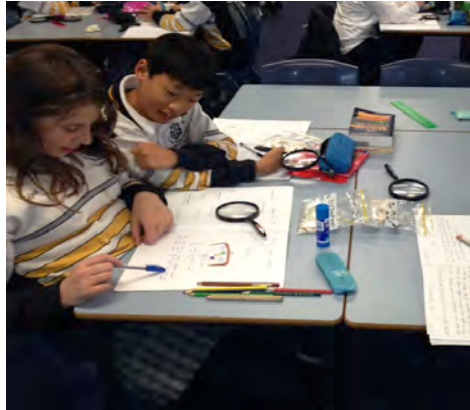
SLiME!

Kids love slime! This second experiment involved a chemical reaction between borax and PVA glue. The result, with a lot of stirring and some food colour was...SLIME. Our slime lasted until lunchtime, after which it turned to putty! Lots of great messy fun and stretching competitions were had in the meantime.



STAGE 3 SCIENCE

Science has been a big focus this year. Classes across stage three have been participating in a range of lessons from the primary connections units. These units link the teaching of science and literacy in an exciting and rewarding way. They lead the students on an enquiry based learning journey using the strategies of the five E's (engage, explore, explain, elaborate and evaluate). The students question and discover a realm of knowledge relating to these units. This year, stage three have participated in numerous hands on activities from the following units; *What's the matter? Marvellous microorganisms, Light shows and Essential energy.*



Stage three classes also participated in brain break science activities during science week this term that allowed them to further explore other science concepts outside these units.

Recently the students reflected on these experiences and made comments about what science means to them, here are just a few of their responses.

The School Bus Route is Changing!



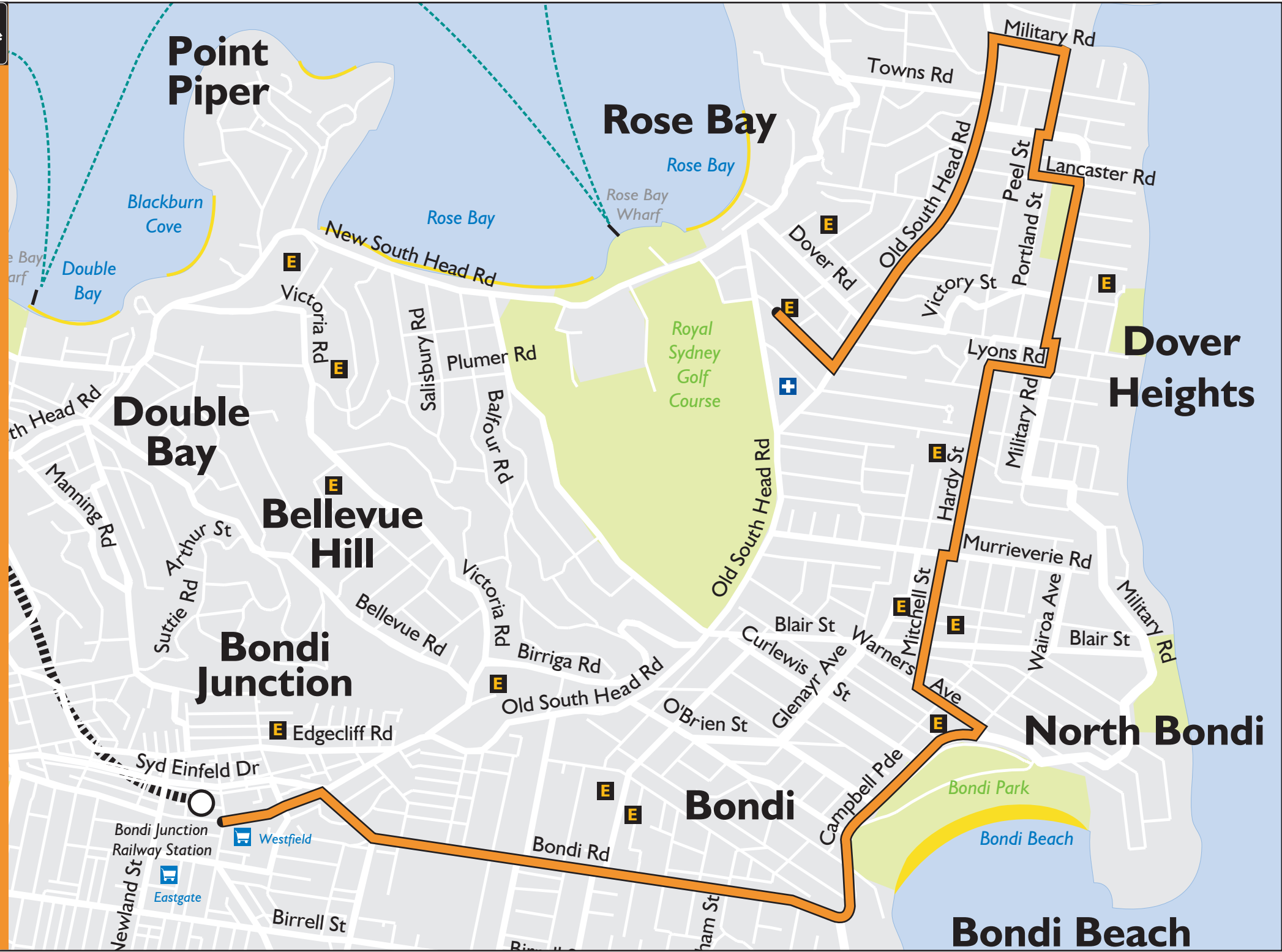
When? Tuesday 8 October (First day of Term 4)

What is changing?	The afternoon bus route 606 will be modified to include parts of North Rose Bay, Vaucluse and Dover Heights.
What is the new route?	The bus will turn left onto Old South Head Rd from Albemarle Ave, right onto Military Rd, right onto Koboda Rd, left onto Peel St, left onto Lancaster Rd, right onto Military Rd, right onto Lyons Rd, left onto Hardy St, right onto Murriverie Rd, left onto Mitchell, left onto Wairoa Ave, right onto Campbell Pde and then express to Bondi Junction. A map showing the new route is attached.
Will the new route cover the existing route?	The new route will cover most of the existing route, as well as the additional areas outlined above. The only areas which will not be covered by the new route are Old South Head Rd between Albemarle Ave and Murriverie Rd, and the western end of Murriverie Rd.
Will the timing change?	There will be no change to the bus's current departure time from the school (ie 3.32 pm daily). However, the trip will take longer. Sydney Buses anticipates that the bus will arrive in the Bondi Basin and at Bondi Junction Interchange approximately 16-18 minutes later than the current arrival times.
Are there any alternatives?	Students wishing to travel to Old South Head Rd south of Albemarle Ave, or who wish to make a quicker journey to Bondi Junction via Birriga Rd, will be able to use the existing 633 school special route. That bus stops outside the school every afternoon and takes a more direct route to Bondi Junction. The route for the 633 bus will not be altered. See the Sydney Buses website: http://www.sydneybuses.info/schools/rbps/633c?activation_date=2013-07-14
Supervision	A teacher is currently rostered on each afternoon to supervise students as they wait for and board the 606 bus. This arrangement will continue when the new 606 route is implemented. Teachers will not be able to supervise students wishing to use the 633 route or any other government buses.
Bus fares	Children who live more than 1.6km from the school (radial distance) and all children in K-2 are entitled to a free school bus pass. Application forms are at the office. Children not eligible for free travel are welcome to use the bus as fare payers. Term bus passes are available from State Transit for \$50.00. Alternatively, students can pay per trip or use a "Travel Ten" bus ticket.
Parents	Paying adults are welcome to accompany their children on school buses. You may wish to join your child on the bus the first few times to help him or her become familiar with the route.
