Professional Learning at Rose Bay

Rose Bay PS has benefited from the ongoing academic partnership with TRIO Professional Learning. The consultants at TRIO feel like members of staff, as they have been regular visitors to the school in 2016. During the past year they worked beside teachers during planning and provided several after school professional learning sessions. The courses provided by TRIO are accredited through BOSTES and provide accredited hours for teachers maintaining their accreditation.

In 2016 teachers have examined problem solving in maths and the role of grammar in reading and writing. Leadership and collaborative planning have also been addressed. All sessions are grounded in the NSW English and Mathematics syllabus documents and the TRIO consultants facilitate the ongoing professional learning sessions. Collaborative discussions with teachers provide all teachers with opportunities to develop their practice and meeting at regular intervals throughout the year deepens understanding.

This process is a very effective way for all teachers to expand their knowledge of best practice and reflect on how to improve student-learning outcomes.

Rose Bay PS will continue the professional learning partnership with TRIO into 2017. We look forward to continued rich discussion around effective teaching and learning.

**NSW Government's \$5 million Program for
Additional School Zone Flashing Lights**

Dear Principal

I am writing to inform you that additional school zone flashing lights will soon be installed to protect Rose Bay Public School on Albemarle Avenue.

This is in addition to the rollout of flashing lights to every school in NSW, which the Government completed in January of this year.

All schools that have multiple entrances were eligible to nominate for the \$5m program of additional flashing lights. The locations for additional flashing lights were selected using a risk assessment model which takes into account a number of factors including pedestrian and vehicle volumes, speed limits and sight distances.

The \$5m program of additional flashing lights will protect additional busy entrance points at around 400 schools across the state. Flashing lights will be retrofitted and installed on existing school zone signage wherever possible.

The rollout of additional flashing lights will commence later this year, and will be completed by mid-2017. Roads and Maritime will work with delivery partners to install this important safety infrastructure across the state.

SCHOOL HOLIDAY PROGRAM JANUARY 2017



Stop, Think, Do (6-8yrs, 9-11yrs)

This structured 2 day program develops emotional & social intelligence in children & adolescents. The focus is on social skills training, behaviour management and motivational learning. Through practicing to stop, think and do over and over again in their social interactions, children develop self-discipline, self-control, self-esteem, self-confidence, maturity, respect, empathy, independence and responsibility. 2 separate age groups will be run.

Cool Kids (8-12yrs)

A structured 2 day, skills-based program that teaches children how to better manage their anxiety.
