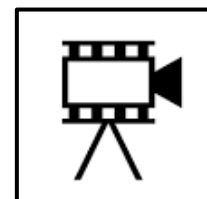
present is suitable for. Bring presents to the office and place under the tree by Monday 17th December. Thank you for giving to those in need.
