RBPS Primary Athletics Carnival Tuesday 30th July

8.45am - Students will depart school on the buses.

9.45am (approximately) - The carnival will commence.

100m Events: 8 years

9 years 10 years 11 years 12/13 years

200m Events: Juniors (8, 9 and 10 years)

11 years

Seniors (12 and 13 years)

100m Finals – Top 8 times in each age group

Field events/novelty activities - including 800m

2.30pm (approximately): The carnival will conclude. If you are planning for your child to leave the venue with another parent, a note must be given to your child's classroom teacher including the arrangements and a signature.

N.B. Any child wishing to participate in a 1500m time trial will meet at E.S Marks at 8.30am. This is a long distance - only children who are considered of district standard should trial. Parents/guardians are responsible for taking their child to the venue.

Students are expected to wear/bring the following items:

- House colour t-shirt and suitable clothes/shoes to participate in events.
- Spikes may be worn for the 100m, 200m and long jump events.
- Hat and sunscreen (a wet weather jacket if rain is forecast)
- Recess, lunch and water to be brought in an excursion bag. (No lunch orders from the canteen on this day)

District guidelines:

- Age groups are based on the age students turn in 2019 the age your child will be on December 31st 2019.
- The 8 fastest times from 100m heats will be chosen for the 100m finals.
- The 200m, 800m races and field events are all straight finals.


