


Keeping your children safe when dropping off and picking up at school



Our car pick up line on Wilberforce Ave is supported by school staff every afternoon. Drivers may drop off and pick up children legally within a two-minute timeframe. Always discuss your pick up arrangements with your child.

Here are a few things you can do to help keep our children safe during drop-off and pick-up times:

- It is helpful for everyone if you park safely, even if you have to walk further to the school gate. This is a good time to model positive road safety behaviour and physical activity for your child.
- Always drop your children off and pick them up on the school side of the road, in our school's designated drop-off and pick-up areas. Never call out to them from across the road - they may run to you without checking for traffic. Drop-off and pick-up areas are always on the school side of the road and are designated by "No Parking" signs.





- Always park and turn legally around schools. Manoeuvres such as U-turns and three-point turns are dangerous during busy school drop-off and pick-up times.

RBOOSH Parent Management Committee—We need YOUR support!

As a community service, RBOOSH aims to provide a quality child care service with a focus on learning and development, in accordance with the principles of the My Time, Our Place & National Quality Frameworks, which meets the needs of children and their guardians. RBOOSH is an incorporated association under the Associations Incorporation Act 2009. All families using the service on a permanent or casual basis, or for vacation care, are automatically registered as members of the association, and each family pays \$2 as part of annual registration fee to become a member.

RBOOSH is led by a volunteer Parent Management Committee. The Parent Management Committee acts as the "Approved Provider" for our service in terms of the Commonwealth's Family Assistance Law. The RBOOSH Constitution includes 8 x elected roles on the management committee – President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, and 4 x Ordinary Members. The 2020 AGM will be held on Tuesday 17 November at 6.00pm and will be conducted via Zoom. During the RBOOSH Annual General Meeting (AGM) these 8 roles are elected. We are seeking volunteers who have between 3-8 hours of time per month to contribute to the committee and subcommittee work.

Involvement in the parent management committee includes:

- 1-2 hours for committee meetings (6 meetings per year)
- 1-2 hours correspondence (per month)
- 1-6 hours (per month) contribution to the tasks of an office bearer role, or sub-committee as an ordinary member
