Return to school-latest news

Thank you for your ongoing support, understanding, patience and messages of gratitude over the past few weeks. This newsletter aims to outline the plans for the full time return to school as announced by the NSW government and Department of Education this week.

Frequently asked questions

Attendance

From Monday 25 May, students will return to NSW schools full time. All students need to return to full time attendance unless:

- they have a medical certificate that states they are unable to return due to an ongoing medical condition.
- they are currently unwell.

Normal attendance procedures apply. Please notify the school if your child will be away and provide a reason.

Drop off and pick up procedures

Things will improve as we get into a pattern, particularly the 3pm pick up for K/1/2. It is not a perfect plan, however moving 600 students off site and managing adults was never going to be perfect. And on cue today, it rained as per Rose Bay tradition. It will just get better.

Can parents come into the school?

No. We usually enjoy having our parents in the school but not at this time. For the moment please only come into the school if:

- signing your child in late or picking them up early from the office.
- collecting a sick child.
- collecting a uniform shop order.

If you do need to come into the main office, please maintain physical distance from other adults, use the hand sanitiser on the shelf at the doorway and wait in the corridor if there are already two people at the counter. The office staff would like to pass on their thanks for all your kind words and patience and understanding on the phone.

What will learning look like?

- From Monday 25 May teachers will be teaching face to face lessons at school for all subject areas.
- Normal student numbers will be in classrooms ranging from 20-30 students.
- Students will attend library lessons.
- Students will engage in non-contact physical education lessons.
- Learning from home programs and resources will no longer be provided as all teachers are teaching face to face.
- For this first week, there will be no homework set to allow children time to settle back in to the school routine and to get organized for each day.
- We will be running staggered lunch and recess breaks to limit the number of children in the playground.

What won't students be doing?

Students won't be involved in:

- assemblies and activities involving large groups of children.
- school incursions or excursions including camps.
- interschool activities such as PSSA sport, athletics carnivals, debating, dance and music events, public speaking, chess, band.
- extra-curricular before and after school activities for the remainder of term 2 and term 3.
- birthday treats or any food to share at school; please do not send.

Our canteen is currently not operational.

Uniform Shop

The Uniform Shop will not open face-to-face but will continue to fill online orders which can be collected from the office. Back-orders and online orders will be processed every Wednesday. A text message will be sent once the order is available for collection. Orders will be placed on a table outside the school office Monday-Friday for collection. Social Distancing Rules must be maintained during collection of your orders please. Health and Safety Practices

The school will be adhering to the health and safety advice as follows:

- Students should remain at home if they are unwell and seek medical advice as required.
- Families are asked not to send food to share (e.g. birthday treats).
- Hand sanitizer will be available in all classrooms and learning spaces for use by children and adults.
- Children will be reminded regularly throughout the day to wash their hands. All bathrooms are well stocked with soap supplies.
- The school has received a significant increase in cleaning hours. We have an additional cleaner onsite during the day who wipes down touch surfaces in all buildings, toilets and the playground.
- Bubblers will not be in use all children need to bring a water bottle.
- There will be no extracurricular visitors on site e.g. OT, speech therapy, specialists
- There is a clear plan in place for schools to respond to any suspected or confirmed cases of COVID-19 in our schools. We are working closely with NSW Health and will communicate with parents if a situation was to arise.
