STAGE 2 PERSUASIVE ADVERTISEMENTS

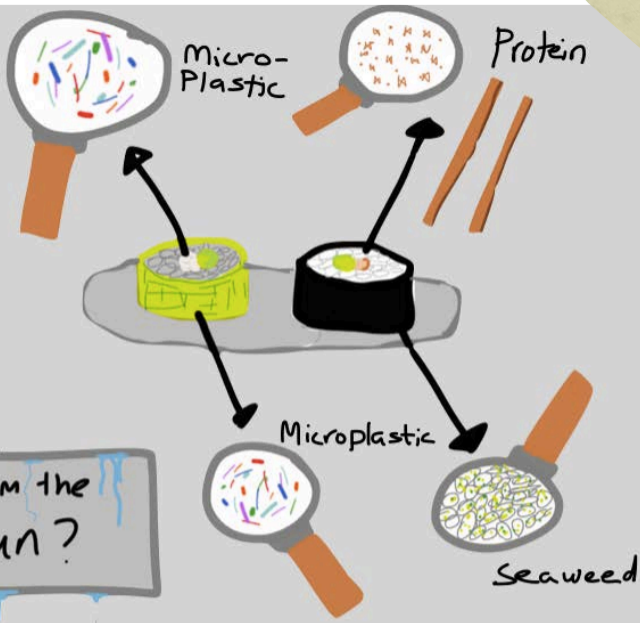


Year 3 and 4 students have been working hard to create advertisements persuading the audience to save endangered animals and to reduce the use of plastic.
