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Languages @ Rose Bay Public School

After a whole school community consultation on languages, in 2023 we will be trialling an expansion to our language program. We will continue to offer French and Hebrew and will now also offer Spanish.

In 2022, students in Kindergarten and Year 1 had the opportunity to learn Hebrew during class time. In 2023, this will be extended to a choice of Hebrew, French or Spanish.

In 2022, students in Years 2-6 had the opportunity to learn French and Hebrew before and/or after school and in 2023 this will be extended to include Spanish. All language programs are extra-curricular and therefore have a cost.

Rose Bay Public School will coordinate the in-class Kindergarten and Year 1 French and Spanish programs. BJE will manage all Hebrew programs, and the Years 2-6 Spanish and French programs will be managed by the language schools. Notifications were sent out this morning to all families.
